

# CHAPTER FIVE

# THE CHRISTIAN, THE JEW, AND ETERNAL DAMNATION

# Jesus and Hitler Endorsed the 7 Death Camps of WWII?? Then Jesus Inflicts His Own Holocaust of Endless Pain and Suffering? Would Not This Make Jesus a Greater Sadist Than Hitler?

WWII saw the creation of seven death camps, Auschwitz, Treblinka, Birkenau, Chelmno, Belzec, Majdanek, and Sobibor in Nazi Germany. It is estimated that approximately eleven million people suffered and died in these camps from gassing, starvation, overwork, shootings, disease, horrific medical experiments, etc. The Nazi "Final Solution" was the extermination of all Jews, and of course those unlucky enough to be thrown in with them. It is only fair to estimate that probably only a small minority of those poor souls were evangelical Bible believing, born again Christians.

Knowing that most, or a large majority were Jewish, it would be evident that they certainly did **not** recognize Jesus as their promised King and Redeemer. Where is all of this leading in regards to the doctrine of "endless punishment?" Simple. The true "endless punishment fundamentalists" teach that all of these unbelieving souls, instantly, (upon their demise in the camps), were sent by Jesus to be tormented in burn-

ing Hell, and then later the Lake of Fire for all of endless eternity. No hope, signed sealed, and forever damned eternally.

If you the reader are a believer in endless damnation for the unsaved, then just go to the surviving loved ones of those gassed in Nazi death camps, and tell them that Jesus took their loved ones after death and sent them to burn in Hell's fires and the Lake of Fire for eternity after they were so viciously tortured and put to death by Hitler's depraved guards! Augustinian theology's monstrous accusation against Jesus our compassionate Savior! Yes, someone says, Jesus said He was/is the only way of salvation, and one cannot go to Heaven unless he comes by the way of the cross. To which we heartily agree, the Bible is plain on that point. Enlarging on where this is leading, does not the Lord Jesus know the end from the beginning? Is He not the creator of all things, the creator of Heaven and Hell as well?

Now since Jesus knew the eleven million souls were going to be exterminated before it happened, then when it did happen those eleven million souls were exterminated under the watchful eye of Jesus. Upon arriving in these death camps, women with children, children, elderly and unable to work, were immediately sent to the gas chambers, while able-bodied men and women were sent to work at slave labor. Just think of the thousands and hundreds of thousands children of all ages tortured and put to death, precious children for whom Jesus died, and of whom He said "Suffer the little children to come unto me for of such is the kingdom of heaven." These children raised by Hebrew Jews who rejected Jesus as their Messiah being sent to eternal/endless damnation for not believing in Jesus!?

Children 4-10-12-16 years of age fully aware of what sin is and following the religious customs of their Jewish parents suddenly having their precious lives wickedly snuffed out in the gas chambers, we are to believe Jesus therefore ordered their eternal/endless torment in fiery halls of Hell and later the Lake of Fire upon their demise? Would not such an act by Jesus be an additional "holocaust" upon those souls, and mil-

lions of times worse than what the Nazis did to them? The teaching of eternal/endless damnation certainly gives rise to a 'Jesus inflicted holocaust' upon those poor souls! I am sure our Savior is deeply grieved and offended by such theological nonsense especially when He died on the cross that all could be saved.

Scripture says Jesus is the "Savior of all men, especially of them that believe (I Tim. 4:10), and also that Jesus/God the one who is not "willing that any should perish but that ALL should come to repentance." (II Pet. 3:9). Is He not the one who is the "light that lighteth every man that cometh into the world?" (Jn. 1:9). If all does not mean 'all' then what does it mean pray tell? Is not Jesus the Savior who would "... have all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth?" Did not the scriptures prophecy in the O.T. that "... and ALL Israel shall be saved?" Isaiah 45:22-25.

Now according to the doctrine of endless damnation, Jesus must have not only been in sympathy with their execution but fully endorsed it since they were dying without salvation anyway. The purveyors of the doctrine of endless damnation certainly teach that post mortem salvation cannot possibly be. The scripture is plain that He even notes when the sparrow falls! According to the doctrine of endless damnation they could not have had any possibility of salvation anyway, not believing in Jesus, so our Lord knowing they were heading for the gas chambers and execution, (and of course supposedly to the fires of Hell (and the LOF) endlessly forever) therefore had to turn a blind eye to their plight and willingly endorsed their gassing and subsequent eternal/endless damnation.

Are we to believe that Jesus upon seeing the coming execution of eleven million souls did not have the resources, the power, or the ability to stop this that they could possibly have more time to come to salvation especially the children? Are we to believe that Jesus, who is the all powerful God, could have stopped this atrocity, but chose rather to endorse the gassing of these Jews, full well knowing that they would enter the endless damned state? The doctrine of "endless damnation" therefore

unwittingly teaches Jesus was the consenting (?) power behind the Holocaust and of the subsequent entrance of millions of Jews into Hell fire for endless eternity! No! Jesus was not involved in any way with the crimes of the Nazis, and to say that the doctrine of "endless punishment" (at the hands of Jesus since He created Hell) is true is to teach Jesus endorsed the Nazi war crimes.

If endless damnation were true, then Jesus brought the worst horrors imaginable upon those poor souls, much worse than the gassing they experienced by sending them supposedly into endless suffering and damnation at death. So in that case Jesus supposedly brought a much worse holocaust upon the Jews after death! Were we not shocked during WWII at the terrible conditions in these death camps? Were we not shocked at the screams and crying heard in the death ovens as women and children were viciously gassed, screams which guards tried to mask by releasing flocks of geese at the same time?

Now pray tell who was the most vicious tormentor(s) of these poor souls, (A). the Nazi death camp guards as they told these millions they were going in for showers and then turned on the gas, or (B). the "Jesus" who supposedly designed the endless furnace of Hell fire to torture these lost souls for endless eternity? Being gassed only lasted for approximately 30 minutes until all were dead and out of that miserable state forever, but then the eternal/endless damnation "Jesus" supposedly takes over and consigns these same souls to a fiery furnace of unimaginable pain and suffering for endless eternity, a furnace called Hell which He designed for the damned.

This "Jesus" is the "Jesus" of the Bible? NOT HARDLY. The Jesus of the Bible wept over wicked unbelieving Jerusalem, so it is no doubt He also wept over those entering the ovens in the death camps! All fundamentalists (who believe in eternal/endless damnation) hesitate to tell orthodox Jews their dirty little secret that they believe those Jews, men women and children, gassed in WWII certainly went on to burn in Hell fire for endless eternity since they could not have been born again. Why

not? Simply, they refused to embrace Biblical Christianity and Jesus as Messiah!

So it is no wonder that the Jews, the true Orthodox Jews, find "fundamentalist Christianity which teaches the Augustinian doctrine of endless punishment to be so obnoxious and offensive. The idea that Hell/ the Lake of Fire is endless for those suffering there can breed no other implication than the suffering there is not for correction, remedy, and purification but rather for endless retribution, torture pain and suffering, nothing else!

This author needs to remind the reader that certainly there is terrible suffering in *parts* of Sheol/Hades, but that it is controlled, corrective, remedial and for purification, or a burning away of the dross by 'attitude adjustment' but not salvation, though those going there will certainly eventually be saved or born again. (Only the blood of Jesus Christ can truly cleanse away sin) The Lake of Fire is not 'aidios' (endless) but rather 'aionios' or of indefinite duration. Certainly the length of time one lost soul must spend there would vary from person to person, according to their works or wickedness. As well we know that innocent deceased children go immediately to heaven. The 'Jesus' of the Bible was not the 'god' of the death camps, Satan was, plainly so!

# Similarities Between the Jesus of Damationism and Hitler

If our Savior the Lord Jesus Christ is indeed the same Jesus who supposedly orchestrated/allowed or even caused ('caused' as no doubt the Calvinists would arrogantly claim, since they claim that 'God intended for man to sin' see Calvin's Institutes Chapter 23, 3:7&8. Calvin's Institutes) the holocaust, then the two (Hitler and Jesus) would be twins in possibly the most terrible savagery ever to be committed against mankind. In such a case Jesus and Hitler would not only be equals, but Jesus would be infinitely worse as a sadist, yea even the worse sadist possibly since He would be burning and tormenting souls for endless eternity in liquid fire and brimstone.

Here it must be reemphasized that Hell/Sheol is the underworld place of those departed spirits who while not yet partakers of Christ's righteousness in the new birth unto salvation, are there in 'holding' until such time as they stand the Great White Throne Judgment to be judged and punished '... according to their works.' (Damnationists, of course in ignorance, corrupt the scriptures and change this to mean 'Judgment and punishment in fire and brimstone endlessly for eternity.') As well it must be remembered that Hell/Sheol is composed of a number of sections/levels with various conditions therein as discussed elsewhere in this book. No doubt the lowest Hell, is a place of fire and severe punishment therein as shown in Luke 16, while the other levels are lesser in degree, until probably the upper level(s) have little if any suffering, but yea rather isolation etc.

In some of these areas there will be outer darkness as the scripture says with weeping wailing and gnashing of teeth. Here again, as stated elsewhere, this place will be to whatever degree needed, remedial, corrective, and purification of attitude. It can be nothing less since whatever God does, He does for good and righteous reasoning, but never sadistically. Again, some foolishly say, "Oh, then this is really the Catholic purgatory where sins are burnt away as dross," to which the answer is, "Absolutely not, Hell/Sheol is a place of attitude adjustment and as well only the blood of Jesus Christ can cleanse away sin." Sadly Rome has made vast fortunes in bleeding its followers of money to supposedly free their loved ones from the fires of an imaginary purgatory. So just what similarities are there between Jesus and Hitler if indeed Jesus does torment souls in fire and brimstone sadistically endlessly for eternity? Note as follows:

- 1. Hitler was a powerful influential leader of his day. So was Jesus.
- 2. Hitler had a 'plan' which he considered to be the 'only way' or the 'final solution.' So did Jesus. They both said 'I am the way/I have the only way.'
- 3. Hitler's government would tolerate no variation of his doctrines. Jesus said His coming government was absolute and without error, ruling with a rod of righteousness.

4. Hitler's ultimate punishment for refusing to obey him was slavery, pain, anguish, horrible suffering, torture, separation from family and then a horrible death. No mercy with Hitler. Jesus' (the damnationist Jesus) ultimate punishment for refusing to be 'one of his true followers' is the same as Hitler's except one step further. Hitler's ultimate punishment to his enemies permanently ended their pain and suffering by and at physical death. On the other hand, the ultimate punishment the damnationist Jesus gives 'begins' at death and extends for endless eternity, time without end, in liquid fire and brimstone upon the souls of His enemies! The damnationist Jesus and Hitler the same, no possible mercy!!

Cannot one see that if such is true about Jesus then He and Hitler would be equals in wickedness and depravity?! You the reader should be aghast that this false doctrine of endless damnation torment in fire and brimstone has so slandered our blessed merciful and compassionate Savior the Lord Jesus Christ and made Him a depraved sadist, equal to and infinitely worse than Hitler!! God save us from Romish Augustinianism. Just what kind of love is it, for Jesus to tell the unsaved that He indeed loves them and died for them, ut if they don't receive Him then He'll burn them in fire and brimstone for eternity?? That is love?? "That is like a man telling his sweetheart, "Marry me or I'll kill you." No! Rather such nonsense breeds atheism and rejection of the Bible, and voids reciprocal love from man to God!'

# **Evangelizing the Jews**

Evangelizing USING the FALSE CLAIM "your orthodox Jewish ancestors are all no doubt burning in Hell endlessly/ forever" will bring the Jewish communities to Christ???

How many lost souls no doubt, who have been raised in say perhaps very strong orthodox Jewish homes, are deeply offended and driven away from the claims of Christ when the false idea of eternal/endless damnation is applied to their deceased ancestors. These persons, having

come from many, many generations of devout Jewish ancestors, when suddenly confronted with the claims of such false Christian doctrine as stated above, naturally are repulsed and are thereby driven *away from* Biblical salvation. We have seen plainly in the Word of God that "All Israel shall be saved," At the name of Jesus every knee shall bow, of things in heaven and things in earth, and things (those in Sheol/Hades) under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

# Not One of the Seed of Israel Shall Be Lost!

### Isaiah 45:22-25

Look unto me, and be ye saved all the ends of the earth: for I am God, and there is none else. I have sworn by myself, the word is gone out of my mouth in righteousness and shall not return, That unto me every knee shall bow, and every tongue shall swear. Surely, shall one say, in the Lord have I righteousness and strength: even to Him shall men come and all that are incensed against him shall be ashamed. In the Lord shall all the seed of Israel be justified, and shall glory. ALSO NOTICE...

Ro 11:26 And so *all Israel shall be saved*: as it is written, There shall come out of Sion the Deliverer, and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob:

Now in the face of such incontrovertible evidence, who should dare make such a false statement as the heading in this section that "...Jewish ancestors are not doubt burning..."? Preaching/teaching that "all" souls, including those who have died rejecting the Jewish Messiah will ultimately be saved whether in this world or the world to come certainly will increase the possibility of winning our Jewish friends. Yes, all will eventually embrace the Savior in repentance and experience the new birth either in this life or the one to come!

Now who, under heaven, could possibly say that these scriptures will not be fulfilled? Can the Lord Almighty send forth His sworn Word, sworn in His righteousness, to save "ALL" of Israel's seed, and not see it come to pass? What force possible could there be to thwart the will of God Almighty? If there are going to be countless Jews/Israelites to be tormented in the fires of Hell for eternity/infinity, while only a small minority are to be saved and accept Jesus as Messiah then these verses are a plain lie. Who can possibly deny it! For those who claim that the Israelites are included in the N.T. church and vice versa, then it should be very plain that eventually "all will come to repentance." Certainly if God has sworn that all Israel will be saved, then no doubt all gentiles will eventually be saved as well! No need of anyone to go for infinity/ eternity to Hell/the Lake of Fire. Pain bringing sorrow, humility repentance & salvation a blessing indeed.

# Luke 12:47-48 Teaches Endless Punishment?

"And that servant, which knew his lord's will, and prepared not himself, neither did according to his will, shall be beaten with many stripes. But he that knew not, and did commit things worthy of stripes shall be beaten with few stripes. For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required; and to whom men have committed much, of him they will ask the more." Luke, 12:47-48.

John R. Rice, wonderful soul winning evangelist certainly thought so. In his booklet (which clearly teaches endless/eternal damnation for the lost) "Hell What The Bible Says About It," says these verses "... clearly teach that the greater the enlightenment and opportunity which a sinner has the greater punishment will be if he rejects it." He earlier states that "... Judgment will be on the basis of what men deserve. People go to Hell because they deserve to go; some have a worse Hell because they deserve a worse Hell. They will be judged accurately according to God's records of their works and punished in Hell accordingly." (End of quote.)

Naturally the question begs to be answered, where in these verses does it say that the unprofitable servant will be beaten endlessly for eternity? Of course it states that they certainly will be punished, but not endlessly so, and further they are to be punished differently according to light etc. Since the idea here is "length of punishment differs" it stands to reason that they will not be beaten forever/endlessly! Not only that but this scripture does not indicate anything such as endless punishment (damnation) in these verses.

If anything, these verses definitely teach first, that sin will be punished, secondly that the sin will be punished according to its degree, thirdly that the punishment will not be endless ("many" stripes are not "endless" stripes.) No doubt this is a parable, but a parable in itself still is a realistic true story drawn from real life, and no one believes that a dishonorable servant should be beaten continuously for eternity.

These verses plainly and irrefutably teach temporary severe punishment according to their sins. Another point, is Rice claims that "Hell" is the place where man is punished according to his sin/wickedness, and while it is true that there are various levels of Hell in the underworld, Ps. 86:13, (no doubt each level with much, some, little, or little if any suffering) the only place man truly is judged and punished according to his personal sins is in the Lake of Fire Rev. 20, and that punishment is clearly stated to be according to their "works" and not punishment "endlessly and for eternity."

Rice further (in error) states "... how freely men will be permitted to indulge their sinful appetites ..." (*In Hell. ed*). Sorry, no truth here. The wicked will have no means of exercising their sins, but will be thoroughly humbled with excruciating pain and suffering. It is plain even in this life, that when any person is enduring severe pain and suffering he/she will have no interest in committing sin. People in Hell will have no interest in sinning, but rather will anticipate the eventual coming end of their justified suffering, when every knee shall bow and every tongue shall gladly confess before the Savior.

Lastly he states, "We may be sure that most of the people in Hell did not expect to go there..." While no doubt this is true, we can be sure that as Revelation 20 plainly states, "... and the Devil that deceived them was cast into the Lake of Fire." To believe that God would allow man to be deceived by Satan and then burn/torture/punish him in endless fire and brimstone for eternity is too much to believe. The Bible simply does not state such. At the Great White Throne, all souls standing this Judgment will be "... judged according to their works," (not endlessly/eternally judged) which clearly indicates varying lengths of time for punishment, certainly not endless eternity!

To use the old argument that 'God doesn't send anyone to Hell, they send themselves there,' sounds good, but the reality is that first, God/ Christ did indeed create/invent Hell and all the punishment therein, and secondly the Lord does indeed send souls there for their rejection of salvation, and thirdly there is no justice in giving infinite punishment for finite sins, and especially so for those who were deceived ('tricked' a good word) by Satan.

For Rice who believes in endless/eternal damnation in Hell fire, to say these verses refer to lost souls in Hell simply does not wash. In noticing the preceding context it is easy to see that there is a 'servant/lord' works relationship being examined, and we know that 'works' does not bring salvation from damnation, since we are saved by grace through faith. Eph. 2:8-9. In all probability these verses are referring to the Christian's judgment at the Bema Seat of Christ, where our works are placed before us for reward or rebuke. See II Cor. 5:10 & I Cor.3:11-15.

Rice states Chapter 5, "Keeping People out of Hell: The Soul-Winning Motive" is the reason we should win souls to Christ.

While this is absolutely true, some will ask if Hell/Lake of Fire is not endless then no need to have such concern. To which we answer that even in this life, we as compassionate human beings seek to alleviate pain and suffering whenever and wherever we are able, 'loving our neighbor' as ourselves. For us to help the wicked unsaved find salvation

and redemption in Christ, freedom from the enslavement of sin, and all the happiness and joy the Christian life brings with it upon conversion and salvation, must be paramount to allowing the lost go on in their sin, misery and shame with only tremendous suffering after death to come. Any Christian who is unconcerned about the unsaved and the horrors they face in Sheol/Hades in the next life, cannot be right with the Lord.

# The False Guilt Trip of the Damnationists

A very strong doctrine of the Damnationists to encourage fervent soul winning is to teach and preach that we as Christians could well be the reason someone will spend endless eternity in Hell-fire if we don't attempt to win them to a saving knowledge of Christ. The point is often made from such churches that many many souls have died and gone to a Christless grave and on to endless damnation due to our failure to reach them in soul winning with the gospel. Nothing could be further from the truth. While yes it is true, that if we fail to win a person to Christ, they will undoubtedly be sent to Hell/Sheol/Hades to await their sentencing at the White Throne Judgment.

As well they will miss the rapture/translation of the church, and in being here to rule and reign with Jesus for a thousand years in the Millennial age. Such false theology as above in *our* sending anyone to endless Hell fire/damnation certainly does load followers of such doctrine with extreme guilt ridden motivation and fear for the lost, but it is still a lie!

1. No lost person will be able to say "So and so didn't witness to me so I was lost." Yea rather the Word of God is quick to set the record straight by saying, "He that believeth not shall be damned," and thus putting the final blame not on us, but on the lost sinner. If a lost man could use the afore mentioned as an excuse, then no doubt God on judgment day would not be justified in sending him to Hell fire. In fact if death is the final determining point of salvation or damnation, then many untold millions and millions would be justified to give Jesus the simple excuse, "I never had a chance to be saved due to the

- failure of your Church but would been saved had they witnessed to me, I was totally ignorant of the true plan of salvation."
- 2. Dr. John R. Rice, great soul winning evangelist of the last century related a story in one of his booklets concerning his failure to win a man to Christ, a man he felt led to witness to but did not, and soon thereafter the man died, to all appearances unsaved. He related that he felt that due to his failure to win the man, he would be guilty of the man's eternal never ending damnation according to Ezekiel and the 'bloody hand warning.'

## Ez. 33:7-9

"... I have made you a watchman for the house of Israel, therefore you shall hear a word from my mouth and warn them for me. When I say to the wicked, "O wicked man you shall surely die," and you do not speak to warn the wicked from his way, that wicked man shall die in his iniquity, but his blood I will require at your hand. Nevertheless, if you warn the wicked to turn from his way, and he does not turn from his way, he shall die in his iniquity but you have delivered your soul.

Now the only thing that this scripture clearly teaches, is that if we as Christians do indeed fail to win the lost to Christ when we have the opportunity, and refuse to do so, then we become guilty in 'aiding and abetting' their rejection of Christ, which for a Christian is a sin and an extremely serious matter. And yes we certainly will have guilt having their 'blood' on our hands, but won't be sending them to an endless eternal suffering in Hell-fire.

3. Now if the damnationists doctrine of endless damnation in Hell fire be true then for a Christian to stumble, or cause an ignorant man to go to Hell by not witnessing to him would cause a huge problem. The problem would be a question which must be answered. The question simply is this. What pray tell, should be the Christian's punishment for sending that poor soul to endless damnation,

if endless damnation be true? What sin could a Christian commit which would rise to the level of sending a poor ignorant soul to a burning Hell for eternity? Murder? Adultery? Pedophilia? Apostasy? The answer to that is NONE. Absolutely NONE!! Should not the punishment fit the crime?

Does not the Word of God teach capital punishment for serious sins? IF, and we say IF a Christian could possibly send another man to Hell for eternity by not witnessing to him, or failing to do so, then there could be no greater sin he could commit than that! So what should be *his* punishment? To be consistent it should be capital punishment!? Here you would have a poor ignorant soul for whom Christ died, dying and supposedly being sentenced to burn in Hell fire for eternity because some Christian did not witness to him, but the Christian who failed to witness goes on to spend eternity in Heaven, but only losing some 'rewards' at the Bema Seat of Christ!? Does that at all make any sense?

Then the big question looms, "Which person has sinned greater, the poor lost soul who died in ignorance, or the Christian who failed/refused to witness to him, supposedly causing him to go to endless damnation?" The answer to that is the <u>Christian</u> would be guilty of not only a sin which completely overshadows that sin of the lost soul, but of an infinite sin since it caused an infinite amount of pain and suffering to that lost soul! So put the Christian to death?

4. Then again, another very serious question on the heels of the previous "3" question of justified punishment due to the Christian who refuses to go soul winning and engage the lost in personal witnessing. What should the church do regarding punishment for such Christians which fail to evangelize and win souls if endless damnation is true and the lost are stumbled into endless torments by them? Certainly if E.D. is true then the church must enforce the greatest punishment possible upon the guilty church members who fail to evangelize and win souls. Such sin would again be greater

than fornication/adultery murder etc. and as such would demand to be severely punished to the highest degree!

If such sin should not be punished, then the lesser sins mentioned must not be punished and who would believe that?! Most evangelical churches today are nearly destitute of members who are strong personal soul winners! The same with pastors, teachers, and evangelists. These churches that hold persons who have been through a divorce and have remarried in the shadow of adultery, refusing them to hold leadership positions in the church, yet are themselves often very weak in personal soul winning and evangelism. So if E.D. is true, and poor ignorant souls can be stumbled into Hell-fire by those who do not win souls (or try to), then the greatest punishment possible should be levied against all in the church who fail to win souls.

That would be most of the congregation no doubt, and soon after such punishment these churches would have empty pews. What hypocrisy! No! The false idea that we can "stumble" someone into endless Hell-fire is totally false. What is true though is that we *can* possibly stumble the lost into Hell by refusing to witness to them, but that Hell is not going to be endless! Now this last point is absolutely intolerable for a Christian/parishioner to sin in regards to.

Our motivation for winning the lost is that we are commanded to do so. Salvation will bring them to a blessed life in Christ Jesus freeing them from sin and sinful habits, bringing glory to God, and keeping them from the pain and suffering of Hell for their sins. These are the main reasons for soul winning. No Christian is right with the Lord who refuses to share the good news of the Gospel. Think about the Day of Judgment, when that lost soul stands before God, (and supposing endless damnation is true) he hears his sentence for eternity in the Lake of Fire. His answer to God? "Lord, you must have mercy on me since I died in ignorance and unbelief because this Christian did not witness to me.

Also as well, since he failed to warn me, now HIS failure to do so is

about to cause me endless suffering in Hell fire, while HIS 'reward' is to spend eternity in Heaven and mine in the Lake of Fire. Am I about to get infinite punishment for HIS infinite sin against me while he goes to Heaven forever and me to Hell fire endlessly forever? Is that just and fair?" Any Christian who thinks that would be fair and just for such to be has a perverted sense of justice!

No! The damnationist's doctrine of endless damnation here as always, fails the scriptural test of reason, the Bible and sanity. This doctrine of E.D. breeds the worst feelings towards those who the damnationists hold as being without hope, and incorrigible. Rather than pray and continually work for their salvation, they give up the struggle to win them to Christ, and often rejoice when that soul dies and goes to Hell. Yea rather they should never give up on praying and working for the salvation of any lost soul!

Lastly, we in no way wish to lessen the concern Christians should have for the lost and winning them to Jesus. The lost will go to suffer in Hell fire for their sins, and as well the Lake of Fire but thankfully the Word of God states the universal salvation of all men regardless, and that of course after severe punishment, humbling, and a bowing of the knees before Jesus and receiving forgiveness and the new birth into the family of God.

Lastly, is it any wonder many people are naturally offended when we as soul winners ask them, "Are you saved?" Why so? Simple. For hundreds and hundreds of years, fundamentalists have ignorantly held to the false doctrine of endless damnation based on the corruption Augustine introduced into the early Christian church, which corruption has continued even down to this day. Who among the unsaved, non churched are *not* aware that modern fundamentalist type Christians generally hold to the Augustinian perversion of God's punishment for the wicked/ unsaved, namely that God supposedly inflicts *infinite* endless pain and suffering in Hell-fire for *finite* sins for eternity?

When any unsaved/liberal rational thinking person logically weighs out such an injustice, naturally he or she can easily dismiss such a god, and the question asked. Naturally they easily scoff at the question asked them, "Are you saved?" since the fundamentalist is not asking if they are saved from God's punishment for their sins, but in reality are asking "Are you saved from God's endless/eternal punishment?" Little wonder that in that sense they feel right in answering that they reject such a question asked of them since it denotes the unjust/false doctrine of endless punishment. Sadly, no doubt their conscience congratulates them for rejecting such a god, (which it should).

In reality they should be concerned that indeed severe, yea maybe even horrible punishment is awaiting them after death at the hands of a truly just God. Someone needs to explain just why the damnationist believes anything *less* than endless torment in Hell-fire and brimstone would not be, or is not sufficient punishment for the unsaved dead!

Is it any wonder that so many lost souls readily scoff at the 'Are you saved' question considering that such question is most always readily connected to the damnationists false concept of God and endless damnationism. As well, no wonder so many of these die lost, perceiving that this God is not worthy of bowing before due to His supposed injustice of infinite punishment for finite sins. A shocking question then arises which is, 'Are the damnationists bowing before a false god, and if not then just what god do they really worship since the god of endless damnation is a false god, and simply does not exist except in doctrinal fantasy!?'
